Mala Mala Game Reserve

Next, Pretoria, South Africa to Mala Mala Game Preserve in Sabi Sands, East South Africa.....ahhhhhhhhhh the lifestyle!

At the fabulous new airport in Johannesburg we boarded the small South African Airways jet and soared again across Africa onto the next adventure. We landed on a small airstrip at Mala Mala and the Land Rovers were there to greet us with our private guide, Jamie. Jamie is an English South African from Durban, 20 years old and very knowledgeable about Mala Mala. He was our ranger for the entire time we were at Mala Mala. We also had a private tracker, John, from the Shaangan tribe. The Shaangan's split from Shaka, and the Zulus and migrated to the North in the area which is now Kruger Park. The most famous, exclusive Game Preserves are on the outskirts of Kruger Park. Kruger Park is the size of the state of Michigan! The wild animals roam all throughout the park as well as in and out of the camps! We were driven then, to the Main Camp of Mala Mala, one of the most famous and exclusive Private Game Reserves in the world. Mala Mala is the Shaangan word for Sable. It's very famous and many American Presidents and movie stars have stayed there. We were shown to our beautiful suite and we could not believe it! We had a suite that was 1,000+ square feet, 2 large bath rooms, an entire great room and a double veranda looking over a manicured lawn right onto the Sand River and right when we walked in the room, across the river, right across from our suite was a giraffe to meet and greet us! We were asked to meet on the deck to be ready shortly thereafter to commence on our first game drive for our stay. Off we took and we were not disappointed. It was so beautiful to be out on a game drive to watch and photo the animals.

Jan was excited to see animals that weren't hiding from us. Although the animals are still very extremely wild and living in their natural habitat, they have become habituated to the Land Rover vehicles. Consequently we were able to get quite close and observed their lifestyle. Upon our first drive, while crossing the Sand River, there were 2 male Lions and Bill got one of the most amazing photos, in fact we are going to send it in to Safari Magazines if turns out! We also plan to enlarge it, frame it and put it in our art gallery! We saw giraffe, elephant and leopard the first night. We stopped for sundowners and just enjoyed our time so much. anniversary together. This Game Lodge is very small and extremely expensive. We were thrilled to have this opportunity to see the animals and stay at one of the top lodges in the world. When we returned we got ready for the evening and met some nice guys from Charlotte, North Carolina in the bar. We shared stories and enjoyed each other's company. Then dinner was served in the enclosed boma. A boma is an area that is enclosed by tall reeds so that the animals will not get through. It is a treat to be in a huge boma like this. They served wild game and all kinds of exotic African food that you cannot find anywhere in the world. The sights of all the servers dressed in red is amazing. After dinner, the entire wait staff, not including the game drivers sang to us several songs in their native tongue, acapella. It was just beautiful. The next morning, we were up at 5:30am to be served tea and coffee on the deck and depart on the game drive as soon as possible. We watched the sun rise and again, immediately started seeing wild game on our drive. We saw many impala, buffalos, rhinos, lions, warthogs, bushbucks, nealas, birds galore, giraffes, zebra and had a fantastic animal viewing. One outstanding adventure was when we drove into a heard of 300 Cape Buffalo! RIGHT in the middle of hundreds and hundreds of buffalo in the middle of the herd!!!! We were so close that we could touch the buffalo! AMAZING! We saw young bulls locking horns, in a form of juvenile positioning. We saw young calves suckling their mothers, we spent most of the morning watching. We saw the Oxpecker birds on the buffalo, just beautiful mother nature at work.

On one of the drives we got to drive right in the middle of an elephant herd of about 40 elephants. At one point we apparently separated a one year old baby from it's mother and boy did it let us know. It trumpeted at us, squealed, shook it's trunk and ears, stamped it's feet and finally ran around the vehicle to it's mother! Thankfully, the mother react!

During our time at Mala Mala, Bill bought Jan a beautiful gold bracelet with a Leopard on it because he knew how much she wanted to see the Leopard in the wild and never had yet. And Bill wanted her to have this beautiful piece of jewelry to remember our time at Mala Mala.

It turned very cold, so we bundled up and on one drive we came upon a Cheetah which had just killed an Impala and was feasting on it. By the time we got back to the Main Camp, it was too cold to eat outside so we stayed in the Main Camp area to have another feast. The following day we again went on game drives and had a scrumptious dinner in the boma complete with fabulous entertainment again. Our final day we opted out of going on the early game drive as it was thundering, lightening and pouring down rain and it was too cold. That night, we hosted a private dinner for our Ranger and new friends from the UK in our huge suite. The staff took incredible care to make it a perfect perfect perfect

evening. They brought the most amazing African dinner to our suite, and stayed to the end to serve us and to make the evening magical.
